2024 GOLD COAST SUPER SENIORS CLASSIC**

TOURNAMMENT PLAYING CONDITIONS

1. Tournament Procedure

The tournament will be played as follows:

- The Gold Coast Super Seniors Classic – stroke play over two rounds of 18 holes, to be played at Coolangatta/Tweed, West Course 14th & 15th October;
- The entire field is expected to contest all events and must play as drawn. Both days will be a shotgun start as per the printed timesheet;
- Once posted, there will be no opportunity for players to change their groupings or tee.
- The leading player at the end of 36 Holes stroke shall be named the winner of the Gold Coast Super Seniors Classic and the best stableford score at the end of 36 holes will be awarded the winner of the Gold Coast Super Seniors Classic and the best stableford score
- In the event of a tie in any event: ties shall be determined using the Golf Australia Countback System.

2. Tournament Play Committee

The Tournament Play Committee:

- Will comprise the Tournament Director, the Secretary GCDGA, an executive member of the GCDGA as well as an official from the Cool/Tweed Match Committee.
- In the absence of a full Tournament Play Committee, such members that may be present at the time may give a decision, and any decision so given will be deemed to be a decision of the full Tournament Play Committee.

3. Rules of Play

- The Rules of Golf, as set out in “The Official Guide to the Rules of Golf” (effective January 2021) will apply, together with any additional Local Rules as drawn up by the Tournament Play Committee.
- Players wishing to gain access for a practice round may do so at their own expense. **This must be booked through the proshop in advance.**

4. Entries

- Age/Handicap: Eligible players are male amateurs aged over 60 at the commencement of the event and must be in possession of a golflink handicap provided by a **landed club**. Handicap limits will be at the discretion of the Tournament Committee;
- Entry Fee: Varies in accordance with club membership, cart requirements etc and is stated when players register and pay via a credit card. FULL REFUNDS are available up o 2 weeks prior to the event, after which \$20 will be deducted from the original cost of registration.

5. Motorised Transport

Motorised transport is not compulsory for play during the tournament, If you require a cart please reserve it through the proshop and pay for it on the day in the Proshop.

6. Practice

Rounds prior to Tournament Play:

- No practice play is permitted on the course proper on the day prior to any round;
- Practice rounds prior to the day of the tournament are at the discretion of the host club.
- The Driving Range and the nearby chipping and putting greens are available.

7. Registration

- All players must have completed the on line registration and payment through Golf Genius.

8. Pace of Play

- Pace of Play will be monitored by GCDGA Executive and the Course Marshal from Coolangatta/Tweed GC;

9. Prizes

- All prizes from Day 1 will be presented at the end Of Day Two at Presentations. On Day 2 all of the 18 hole as well as the 36 hole prizes will be presented.
- A player may only win ONE daily 18 hole event prize and ONE 36 hole event prize (which ever is of the greater value).
- Prizes will be awarded in the following order based on value:
 - * All age 36 hole stroke winner
 - * All age 36 hole stableford winner
 - * Division 1 (60-64 years) – 36 hole stroke and stableford winners
 - * Division 2 (65-69 years) – 36 hole stroke and stableford winners
 - * Division 3 (70 & over) – 36 hole stroke and stableford winners
- Daily Gross & Stableford Prizes will be awarded in all age divisions;
- Daily nearest the pins will be provided on 4 par 3 holes. These will be open to any age group

10. Measuring Devices

- The use of conforming Measuring Devices for distance only is permitted;

11. Scoring:

All players will receive a video link in the email out prior to the tournament which will explain how to use the App for scoring

- It is expected that all players will use the scoring App to record scores.
- A daily GGID will be provided on each card for the group so that scoring can be completed
- A paper score card will be issued and this MUST be completed and signed off by a marker from your group. The card will be the “point of truth” and will be used to determine any inaccuracies.
- Players are required to confirm their scores are correct from the video display within 15 minutes of electronic submission via the App
